2021 Presidents Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors I am pleased to present this report to the 50th Annual General Meeting of the Finley RSC. The 2021 year has certainly been an interesting and challenging one for Finley RSC. The continued challenges and disappointments due to the COVID-19 pandemic and staffing issues have significantly impacted all areas of the club's operations. We want to thank our members and guests for your continued compliance and understanding as staff implement the government regulations that are in place to keep everyone safe

The club continues to remain in a strong financial position and the 2021 Financial Statements show that the Club had a very successful year, recording a net profit of \$370,586. As was the case last year, the club received Covid-19 stimulus payments and Government Grants. During the year the non-core 74 Tocumwal Street premises was sold.

Last year we undertook a substantial renovation to the Catering and mixed lounge area of the Club. The total cost of the project was \$722,000 contributing to this was the Building Better Regions grant of \$250,000. During the renovation our Catering Section was closed for nearly four weeks. As a result, we now have a new commercial kitchen space, new toilets and a modern dining area for our members and guests to bring family and friends.

From a Catering perspective, whilst Kate and her team have had a difficult time with the shutdown and restrictions, the Catering Section and menu has provided an outstanding facility and service for our members, the local community and visitors. I must also congratulate Santosh on taking on the Head Chef position, his contribution must be commended. Kate's touch in decorating the venue along with her generosity in accommodating the needs of groups and individual requests is a positive for the club.

I want to thank the Board for their commitment and dedication to our club and for the support you have given me. You have all carried out your



responsibilities in a very professional manner and all decisions are considered and made to ensure the continued success of our Club. In particular, I want to acknowledge the work of our General Manager, Sharen Parmley and our staff members for their hard work to manage and support the club through these difficult times. On behalf of all members, I thank our team for their tireless work in adjusting to the sudden changes and challenges over this last year and helping to ensure the club has remained operational and financially viable.

As we move to 2022 we are planning to move the gaming room and that area will become an inside and outdoor lounge area. The new gaming room will be located near the entrance of the club. It will be modern and spacious allowing for both inside and outside areas. The new outdoor lounge will be located adjacent from the sports lounge.

To all those who have lost loved ones during the past year, you have our deepest sympathy, and to all those members who are not enjoying the best of health I wish you a speedy recovery.

Finally, I would like to thank you, the members, for supporting your club, and making it such a wonderful and friendly destination where we can connect with friends and family and feel a part of a community

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2021

NOTE:

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The directors have determined that the company is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing the financial report to the members and must not be used for any other purpose. The directors have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

Finley Returned Soldiers Club Limited is a company limited by guarantee, incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

Basis of Preparation

The report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Corporations Act 2001, and in accordance with Accounting Standards which include Australian equivalents to International Financial Reporting Standards ('AIFRS') and other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board. Compliance with AIFRS ensures that the financial report, comprising the financial statements and notes thereto, complies with International Financial Reporting Standards ('IFRS').

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements;

AASB 107: Cash Flow Flows;

AASB 108 Accounting policies, changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors;

AASB 110: Events after the Reporting Date;

AASB 1004: Contributions;

AASB 1048: Interpretation and Application of Standards;

AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures.

No other Accounting Standards, Accounting interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

Reporting Basis and Conversions

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historical cost. It does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuation of non current assets. Cost is based on the fair values of consideration given in exchange for the asset.

The following is a summary of the material accounting polices adopted by the entity in the preparation of the financial report. The accounting polices have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

NOTE:

1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

(a) Revenue

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon delivery of the goods to the customers

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when it is controlled. When there are conditions attached to the grant revenue relating to the use of those grants for specific purposes it is recognised in the balance sheet as a liability until such conditions are met of services provided.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest Revenue is recognised using the effective rate method, which, for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to the customers.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(b) Inventories

Inventories are measured at cost, adjusted where applicable to for any loss of service potential.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition.

(c) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, accumulated depreciation.

Property

Freehold land and buildings are measured on the fair value basis, being the amount for which an asset could be exchanged between knowledgeable willing parties in an arm's length transaction.

Plant and Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis less depreciation.

Depreciation

All assets, excluding freehold land, are depreciated on a diminishing basis over their useful lives to the company.

NOTE: 1 STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (cont'd)

(d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to Balance Sheet date. Employee benefits expected to be settled within one year together with entitlements arising from wages and salaries, and annual leave which will be settled after one year, have been measured at the amount expected to be paid when the liability is settled plus related on costs. Other employee entitlements payable later than one year have been measured at the net present value.

Contributions are made by the Company to employee superannuation funds and are charged as expenses when incurred.

(e) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST is not recoverable for the Australian Taxation Office. In this circumstance the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Receivables and payables in the balance sheet are also shown exclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the cash flow statement on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cashflows.

(f) Contributions

Finley Returned Soldiers Club Limited receives non-reciprocal contributions from the government and other parties for no value or a nominal value. These contributions are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition upon which time an asset is taken up in the balance sheet and revenue in the income statement.

(g) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the entity has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable than an outflow of economic benefit will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

NOTE: 2 REMUNERATION OF DIRECTORS

No remuneration is paid to the Directors of the Company as the Company is limited by guarantee and cannot pay remuneration by virtue of the provisions of its Memorandum of Association.

NOTE: 3 INCOME TAX

Taxation is calculated on a formula applicable to visitors only. From 1994 onwards, the formula changed to allow for the Australian Taxation Office views on the tax treatment of commission type income. As a result, the following taxation payments and provisions were made during the financial year.
